

# Inez L. Feurtado



Inez Louise (Haynes) Feurtado died in her home, on April 18, 2017, at the age of 93. She was born on April 6, 1924 to Ivy and Allen Haynes, in the Sheepshead Bay section of Brooklyn, New York City, NY. Her parents moved there in 1921, when her father built their house. The same house her sister Sylvia Payne lives in

today. Inez was the 5th of 10 children (6 girls, 4 boys).

She was a member of Homecrest Presbyterian Church and was educated in the Sheepshead Bay school system. After graduating from Abraham Lincoln High School, Inez moved to Nantucket. She loved fashion and worked as a seamstress and also did secretarial work. During World War II, she was a "Pin-up Calendar Girl" for the troops.

She then moved to Long Island, where she met LeRoy Feurtado, who was in the U.S. Army. They would be married in 1943. They moved up to Searsport, Maine and built a home on the coast. They had 2 children, Pamela and Michael. They would later move across the street to the home where Inez lived until her death. Inez and LeRoy joined The First Church in Belfast, United Church of Christ in May of 1994. They were much loved and very active there, LeRoy often working with Mike Collins and other men to maintain the building and Inez working with the fairs and other activities.

Inez Feurtado was the beloved mother of Pamela Feurtado Ladmiraault and Michael Feurtado. She was preceded in death by her son Michael on June 10, 1987 and by her husband of 57 years, Leroy Windale Feurtado.

She is survived by 3 sisters and 1 brother, daughter Pamela and her husband Ralph Ladmiraault and their son Jason, of Virginia, as well as son Michael's daughter Ayana, and 5 great grandchildren: Milton, Michael, Malik, Malcolm and Charve.

She was a selfless woman who always put other family members and other people's needs, wants and concerns before her own, acting as caregiver for a number of her great grandchildren even in her last years. She is greatly missed and will live on in the hearts of all who loved her.
